Dear Parents,

We have had a most successful school year. Now, we are preparing for many end of the year activities. Our fifth graders are excited about their end-of-year trip to Disney Quest on May 21st. 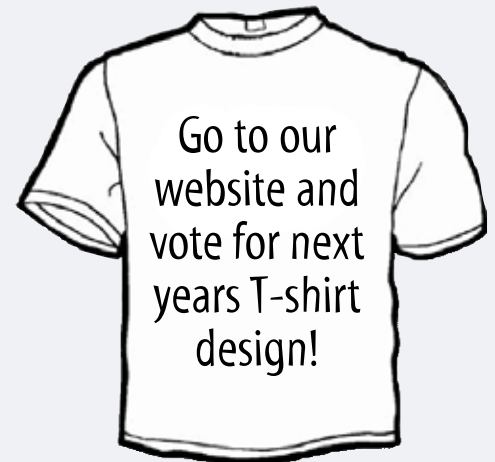

Thank you so much to the PTA (and the parents, students, and community members that attended the carnival) for the generous donation, which will allow us to purchase 17 new computers. This generous gift, combined with our reduced size next year, has greatly contributed to our ability to meet our goal this year to have a modern computer lab for students and staff and our goal to start the fall with 2 modern computers in each classroom for student use. Many thanks!

As summer approaches, Sand Pine students will likely be going online during their many free summer hours. The web can be a fantastic and exciting place for learning; check out the Sand Pine "For Students" area for some great links to educational games and activities. Unfortunately, the web can also be a place where students might run into inappropriate materials or even predators. To prevent students from dangerous and negative encounters, supervise Internet use carefully and encourage computer use in "public" areas of your home, rather than in a bedroom behind closed doors. Talk to your child about appropriate Internet use; try letting your child take the responsibility of making up an Internet use contract for both of you to sign. Finally, remember that MySpace is not appropriate for elementary children; their minimum age limit is 14. Pasco County Schools block MySpace access on all of their computers. If you discover your child has a MySpace page, report it to MySpace, and it will be immediately removed. Additionally, talk to your child about why MySpace is not appropriate for young children. If you need more information about talking to your child about Internet Safety, check out the PTA's Internet Safety link (<http://www.sandpinepta.org/pages/internetsafety.html>) or our new Internet safety parent resource guide under the School Publications link under the For Parents menu on the Sand Pine Website.

A Summer of Fun Learning

You can make sure your children's summer vacation is enriching and entertaining by introducing them to new experiences, encouraging them to pursue their own interests – and combining reading and writing with their new adventures. Check out the library. Take your children to the library regularly. See if your library has a summer club, story hours, or other reading events. -Visit parks, zoos, and nature centers. Visit the library afterward and get books on favorite animals and field guides to help identify wildlife in your area.



Go to museums, science centers, and historical sites. Many have extended summer hours, special exhibitions, and hands-on activities for children.



Read up on your trip. If you are traveling, involve your children in the planning. Read about the trip together and highlight your route on a map.



Encourage pen pals. If your children will be separated from good friends for the summer, suggest that they write to each other. If they have access to e-mail, have them write online.



Share the fun of reading. Encourage your children to swap books with their friends. Host a book party and invite the guests to come dressed as their favorite characters.

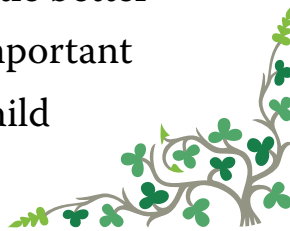
